

Born in Long Island, New York, Antony Wong has been a resident of Manhattan's Chinatown since the age of five. Antony is Program Coordinator for the Asian American / Asian Research Institute (AAARI) of the City University of New York (CUNY), a university-wide scholarly research and resource center on policies and issues that affect Asians and Asian Americans. He received his BA in English from Hunter College/CUNY, and his MBA in Accountancy from the Zicklin School of Business at Baruch College/CUNY.

Appointed in 2010 to Manhattan Community Board No. 2, at the recommendation of Councilmember Margaret Chin, Antony currently serves as Board Treasurer and member of the Traffic & Transportation committee. He previously served on the committees for Chinatown & Neighbors, and Streets Activities & Film Permits. As a member, he has successfully advocated the Board to support the translation of Bike Smart guides by the New York City Department of Transportation into Chinese and Spanish; and the 12% and Growing Coalition's campaign for more fair and adequate funding by the New York City Council to Asian-led or serving organizations.

Antony also serves as a Board Member of the Chinese American Voters Federation (CAVF), a volunteer group dedicated to voter registration.
